Mike Hilton Wins Trustees' Award

Our own Dr. Michael Hilton was presented the 2014 Aerospace Corporation, Trustees' Distinguished Achievement Award "for sustained leadership in guiding the development and insertion of hybrid bearings into satellite mechanisms."

Dr. Hilton is, director, Mechanical Systems
Department, Engineering and Technology Group.
Hilton's acceptance speech provided a mixture of
poignancy and humor, as he discussed medical
advances that he attributed to keeping him alive
with a chronic health condition, and also noted
that the technology he developed for national
security space systems is "now used in
Rollerblades."

For more than 20 years Hilton has been the driving force behind the identification, development, and testing of hybrid ceramic/metal bearing technology — from early concept through insertion into deployed attitude control systems — on national security space (NSS) and commercial satellites. Because of Hilton's vision and leadership, Aerospace was able to help the government and contractors select the best methods to implement this technology; as a result, five systems with hybrid bearings are successfully flying on orbit, with other systems slated to fly in the future.

More than any other single contributor in the field, Hilton has been responsible for the successful adoption and current use of hybrid bearings on NSS systems. It is unusual for one individual to be involved in a technology over such an extended period, particularly when the involvement has included changes in job responsibilities and organizations.

Because Hilton is a recognized national authority on bearings, the government continually consults him not only on current issues, but on plans for future developments.

If you are interested in being an Assistant Scoutmaster you may also apply at 18. To be an Assistant Scoutmaster, you must take the following trainings: Youth Protection Training, Scoutmaster Specific Training, This is Scouting, and Introduction to Outdoor Leadership.

Also, you only have to be 18 years old to be a merit badge counselor. YPT certificate is also needed.

Meeting Night Patrols

Skill Patrol Leaders remember when you are planning the skills for the meeting, make sure different levels of Skills should be worked out, are appropriate to the theme, and that everyone is (and can be) involved. When possible – see if a competition or game & competition can be made out of your skills.

It's the patrol leader's responsibility to make sure they do. *This means picking up the phone to* confirm communication received and understood.

Email or text are OK, but are not a substitute for direct bi-directional **voice** communication – a confirmed Phone message – read back of the message to ensure understanding might be good idea too.

No one in the patrol should leave until everything is cleaned up and put away, or the patrol leader releases them. ASK YOUR PL or SPL BEFORE YOU LEAVE.



Troop 314 Meeting Notes

- Executive Committee Meeting is now on the Wednesday Following JLC. Still starts at 7 PM.
- First meeting Month is now time for Committee Chair Parents Meeting.
- The Second Tuesday is usual time for Scoutmaster Conferences.
- The Third Tuesday meeting includes Board of Reviews for Rank Advancement when not a COH.
- Fourth Tuesday could be for Patrol meetings if you are able to get the Scoutmaster to come early or close late.
- No meetings are usually held on 5th Tuesday. These are saved for Fundraisers e.g.: Dinners.

Court of Honor is held 4 times a year, every three months – usually the last Scout meeting of month (except December).

In **March** and **September COH** Scouts are honored for their rank advancements with a candle lighting ceremony and parents are given pins. This tends to be a long ceremony, so no dinners.

In **June** and **December**, **our COH** does not have candles and rank advancement pins for parents, but we add a potluck dinner in June – (Optional potluck in Dec. but usually kept simple, due to constraints on time and sanity in the holidays).

Tour and Activity Plans - Online

Council will no longer readily accept emailed, faxed or walked in Tour and Activity Plans. They want them on line. Sign into MyScouting.org.

Online, you no longer have to collect signatures. Complete the plan and certify that any missing requirements will be completed before the trip begins. When you submit, an email will be sent to your council, chartered organization, committee chair, and designated emergency contact.

File Tour Activity Plan if the following apply:

- •Trips of 500 miles or more
- •Trips outside of Orange Co. Council borders.
- •Trips to any national high-adventure base, National Scout Jamboree, National Order of the Arrow Conference, or regionally sponsored event
- •When conducting any the following activities:
- •Aquatics activities (swim, boat, float, scuba, etc.)
- ·Climbing and rappelling
- Orientation flights (process flying plan)
- Shooting sports
- Any activities involving motorized vehicles as part of the program (snowmobiles, boating, etc.)
- Any overnight camping

Step by Step: How to file a Tour and Activity Plan Online

Do you have an account at myscouting.org? If not, you should open one. Make sure you have your BSA ID number, and use it to open your account. You can create an account (and even take YPT) without your BSA number, but it will be a headache to then attach your BSA number to your account. If you don't have your BSA number handy, Cindy Bess can get that for you.

So, then go to **myscouting.org** and log in. On the left, you should see a list of Unit Tools, one of which will be "Tour and Activity Plan". Click that.

At the top, you'll see a drop-down box – select "New Plan" (selected by default), and then click "Go".

You'll be presented with a checklist of things to gather. After you've done this a few times, you'll

already have them in the system (like vehicle info). Look over the list, then click "Next".

Select your unit, type of trip (Day Tour), method of transportation (car or van), and an emergency contact. The emergency contact has to be someone who is NOT going on the trip. I habitually select Mike Hilton, but it doesn't have to be him. I believe the info for the emergency contact will automatically fill in when you select their name, because it's stored in the system.

Click Next.

Give the trip a name (such as "Hollywood Sign Hike"), and a short description. Enter the number of participants – Adults Male and Female, and Youth Male.

Click Next.

Enter each registered adult, one at a time, by selecting their name from the drop down list. Info will populate automatically, but you have to indicate whether this person is the primary leader for the trip, whether they are YPT trained, whether they'll be driving, and vehicle info. Make sure you check the box "Vehicle insurance meets state's liability standard" or "Will follow appropriate Department of Transportation guidelines for state and/or jurisdiction". After all the info is filled in, click "Add" in the upper right corner (it's not the logical place to look, but that's where they put it).

Once you have at least one adult listed for the tour, to add another you click the "+" sign next to "Add Registered Adult", near the bottom. Again, click "Add" after all the info is filled in.

When all adults are added, click "Next" at the bottom.

Fill in the "Departing" and "Going To" and "Returning" info, with dates and places.

Click Next.

For "What activity will you be doing?", you have to indicate at least one thing, but since we won't be doing any of the six items shown, just type

"hiking" into the "Other" box.

Click Next.

On the "Are you prepared?" page, you have to indicate who has cpr, first aid, and hazardous weather training, and answer questions about medical forms and permission slips.

Click Next.

On the Notification page, you will be shown a list of people who will be notified about this Tour. Check their emails, and Edit as necessary (they always get Mike's email wrong – it should be ikegy2@gmail.com)

Click Next.

On the summary page, they will point out things that need attention, such as:

Non-current YPT.

Vehicle Insurance not acknowledged. To correct these things, you can just click on the highlighted items. This will take you to the appropriate page where you can add or edit info. To go back to the Summary page, you can just click the last bubble on the navigation bar at the bottom.

From the Summary page, I think you just click "Next" to submit the TAP. The last page gives you an option to print the TAP, which you'll need to do.
